First things first... What is an MGO?

MGOs or Multi-governmental organizations are comprised of countries that come together to form a single entity mostly for trading purposes.

A perfectly suitable example of an MGO is the UN or, the United Nations

an international organization formed in 1945.



A few words about the history of the UN...

As World War II was about to end in 1945, nations were in ruins, and the world wanted peace.

For the next two months, they proceeded to draft and then sign the UN Charter, which created a new international organization, the United Nations, which, it was hoped, would prevent another world war like the one they had just lived through.

Representatives of 50 countries gathered at the United Nations Conference on International Organization in San Francisco, California from 25 April to 26 June 1945.

Now, more than 75 years later, the UN is as active as ever!

Member states

Since its foundation in 1945, the UN is currently comprised of 193 member states including countries from all over the world, (<https://www.un.org/en/about-us/member-states>)



The main bodies of the UN

The main bodies of the United Nations are:

- the General Assembly,
- the Security Council,
- the Economic and Social Council,
- the Trusteeship Council,
- the International Court of Justice,
- and the UN Secretariat.

All were established under the UN Charter when the Organization was founded in 1945.



Goals and purposes

While their work is multi-faceted, the UN's goals can be summarized into the following:

1. Maintain International Peace and Security.
2. Protect Human Rights.
3. Deliver Humanitarian Aid.
4. Support Sustainable Development and Climate Action.
